

CHAIRMAN'S INTRODUCTION

The focus of our recent activity was our visit last year to Portugal to coincide with Torres Vedras Day. We were given a very warm welcome by the Mayor of Torres Vedras, Carlos Bernardes, whose office was of invaluable assistance organising the visit, including inviting us to the Torres Vedras Day dinner held in the atmospheric surroundings of fort São Vicente. Our tour round the lines included lunch at Quinta da Povoa and watching a re-enactment at fort Alqueidão, where we and the Rota exchanged honorary members of our groups. The Rota continue to produce excellent guides to the Lines area. See the website for more details. On Sunday, we visited two vineyards for an excellent wine tasting managed by one of our members, José João Climaco Melicias (Vitiscape). Looking forward, our aim is to mark the Lines day by alternating between visits to Portugal and a dinner in London. For this year's Lines of Torres Vedras Day, we are organising a dinner on 18th October 2019 at the Cavalry and Guards club. All being well, we will organise another visit to Portugal for Lines Day in Ocotober 2020.



Visit to Lines of Torres Vedras, October 2018.

On the weekend of 19-21 October 2018, a group of 17 from the Friends visited Torres Vedras. On the Friday, the group had dinner at a local restaurant with the Mayor of Torres Vedras, Carlos Bernardes. We then attended a very enjoyable orchestral concert by the volunteer firefighters

from the city. Saturday morning, we were officially welcomed by the Mayor at the city hall and given the opportunity to try the new Licor de Vinho, Linhas de Torres Vedras. We then visited fort São Vicente and the new Interpretation Centre there. Next stop was Mount Socorro to take in the magnificent views across the Lines. Lunch was taken at Quinta da Povoa, which was the headquarters of General Spencer



during the occupation of the Lines in 1810-11. Our host, Gonçalo Vasconcellos Guisado, showed us round his fascinating home, provided an excellent meal and an opportunity to try his 'Old Nosey' pear tonic. Saturday afternoon was spent at fort Alqueidão where a historical re-enactment was staged. Also, during this visit the Friends and the ROTA made each other honorary members of their groups.

On Saturday evening, we attended the dinner to celebrate Lines of Torres Vedras Day which was held in a marquee in fort São Vicente. The food and the entertainment were excellent. Our host for the night from the City council was Ana Umbelino. Also, in attendance was ex-MP Antonio Rodrigues who was central to the official recognition of the Lines of Torres Vedras Day. On Sunday, we visited two vinevards managed by one of our members, José João Climaco Melicias (Vitiscape). Our thanks to José for the wine tasting in beautiful settings. Friends) is very much hoping to welcome the Friends of the Lines of Torres Vedras to his elegant and intimate home, his duties permitting. Morning Coffee will be served on arrival at 10:30 a.m. The party will be divided into 5 groups of 10 and given a guided


into 5 groups of 10 and given a guided tour of the house and gardens, which offer an intriguing insight into the life of the Great Duke of Wellington.

We will view the fascinating collection of paintings and furniture and see the wonderful Wellington Exhibition featuring his magnificent funeral carriage and charting his military and political life. The visit will include a light lunch, and afternoon tea.

There are plans to assemble at the Cavalry & Guards Club, 127 Piccadilly, from 7:30 a.m., where coffee and breakfast will be served for those who wish it.

We will leave by coach at 09:00 a.m. sharp, in order to arrive at Stratfield Save House for a 10:30 a.m., morning coffee. The cost of the visit for members has yet to be finalised but it will be in the region of £30 per person. to which the cost of breakfast and a seat on the coach will need to be added. Members and their guests may wish to make their own way to Stratfield Save, and to meet there at 10:30 a.m. We will need to bring our own wine and alcoholic beverages. The FBCE are holding their Winter Recital and Reception on 27 February 2019 at the Cavalry and Guards Club, London. Full details are on the Friends website.


Napoleonic Fair Bingham, 2/3 March 2019.

To be held at Derby Museum and Art Gallery. Keynote speakers include: Dr Andrew Cormack and Dr Jonathan Coates.



Many of you will remember that special and beautiful day at St James's on 9th April 2018 when we unveiled two stained glass windows commemorating the Portuguese sacrifices of the Great War. Incredibly a year has nearly gone by already and shortly we will be approaching the first anniversary.

Last year we only had a temporary commemorative plaque, but as now we have a fine stone plaque in place we feel it appropriate that we should use the first anniversary of the blessing of the windows, to unveil the new plaque. Hitherto it has not been practical to do so. We expect Lord and Lady Guthrie to be present and the Portuguese Ambassador has been invited.

This will take place during mass at 12 noon, after which we have been generously invited to take part in a buffet lunch provided by the nearby Royal British Legion. It is important that we know how many would like to come to lunch. There is no charge for the lunch but there will be a pay bar. A collection will be taken at mass for a Portuguese charity yet to be determined.
