

Report on Lines of Torres Vedras Day, Talk and Dinner, 18 October 2019. Cavalry and Guards Club, London



Events for 2020

Two events are proposed for 2020.

'Walk with Wellington' in London, 1 May 2020. The outline is:


- Breakfast at 08:00 at The Pestana Chelsea Bridge Road Hotel adjacent to Battersea Park where he fought his only duel on behalf of King's College when he was insulted by the Earl of Winchilsea.
- From The Wellington Arch at 10:00
 to walk from Piccadilly to the
 Household Cavalry Museum,
 stopping off at a number of locations
 frequented by Wellington, in off duty
 mode, to explore some of the more
 unusual and unknown haunts of his
 private and personal life.
- Visit the Major General's Office at Horse Guards from 12:30 to 13:30 sharp. These are strict timings, with a maximum of 15 guests at any one time being permitted into the Major General's office.
- A three course lunch at "The Wellington," in The Strand opposite King's College from 14:00.
- After lunch, a visit to King's College, and from there to the Crypt at St Paul's Cathedral where Wellington lies.
- The day will end with tea in the Crypt at St Paul's the site where the alliance between Britain and Portugal was formalised in the Treaty of London on 16 June 1373.

The cost of the tour, excluding public transport, will be £70 per person. This will include a continental breakfast, entry to the Household Cavalry Museum, a set three course lunch, but not beverages, and a cup of tea in the Crypt of St Paul's Cathedral.

Portugal visit, 16-19 October 2020.

In the autumn, we intend to again visit the Lines for the Lines of Torres Vedras day. We will join the official dinner in Torres Vedras on 18 October.

The outline proposal is to arrive during Friday 16 October with a welcome dinner in the evening in Torres Vedras. On Saturday we will visit different forts from the previous visit, plus the Fletcher Monument at Alhandra where the Friends paid to replace the stolen plaques. Lunch is included.




New memorial plaque to Richard Fletcher RE.
