
THE FRIENDS OF THE LINES OF TORRES VEDRAS NEWSLETTER – SPRING 2021

EVENTS FOR 2021 (Covid permitting)


We hope the two events cancelled in 2020 can be run in 2021 although it is too early to confirm this.

- From The Wellington Arch at 10:00 to walk from Piccadilly to the Household Cavalry Museum, stopping off at a number of locations frequented by Wellington, in off duty mode, to explore some of the more unusual and unknown haunts of his private and personal life.
- Visit the Major General's Office at Horse Guards from 12:30 to 13:30 sharp.
- A three course lunch at "The Wellington," in The Strand opposite King's College from 14:00.
- After lunch, a visit to King's College, and from there to the Crypt at St Paul's Cathedral where Wellington lies.
- The day will end with tea in the Crypt at St Paul's the site where the alliance between Britain and Portugal was formalised in the Treaty of London on 16 June 1373.


The cost of the tour, excluding public transport to be confirmed. This will include a continental breakfast, entry to the Household Cavalry Museum, a set three course lunch, but not beverages, and a cup of tea in the Crypt of St Paul's Cathedral.

Portugal visit, October 2021.

In the autumn, we hope to again visit the Lines for the Lines of Torres Vedras day on 20 October. We expect to join the official dinner in Torres Vedras.

The outline proposal is: Day 1 - to arrive with a welcome dinner in the evening in Torres Vedras.

Day 2 - we will try to visit different forts from the previous trip, plus the Fletcher Monument at Alhandra where the Friends paid to replace the stolen plaques. Lunch is included.

Day 3 - we will visit museums and attend municipality events, including the official dinner on the evening.

Day 4 - we will visit the battlefields of Roliça and Vimeiro, with lunch en route. In the evening a wine-tasting, with snacks.

An option is being considered to offer an add-on day 5, to visit Sintra.

Cost to be confirmed, to include four nights' accommodation, 2 dinners, 2 lunches, the wine tasting and the coach. Travel to Portugal is NOT included. Places will be limited to 20.


Forthcoming On-Line events 2021
